



Spring Has Sprung – Be Sure To Call Before You Dig!

With the warm spring weather approaching, so is the avid gardener! It is very important to note that many utility lines run beneath the soil and it is vital to have their location marked before you do any major digging in the garden.



In addition, Cable TV and phone lines often run just 1 to 2 inches below the surface and can be cut even while planting small perennials. Often a Cable TV line can be sliced while edging a bed without noticing it. You may only notice that the connection has been cut when the television stops working. Cable TV is not a life-or-death matter, but if a gas line or power line were cut the consequences could be much more serious.

Fortunately, services offered by Ontario utility companies will mark the location of these lines for free. Contact ontarioonecall.ca first to get a free locate so you can dig safely. Be aware, homeowners are liable for any damage or injury caused by interfering with any power lines, gas lines or any other buried infrastructure.

Dig carefully by hand if you are working within 12 to 18 inches on either side of the location marked for any line.

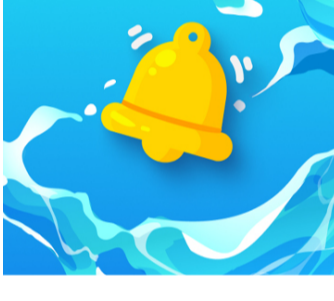

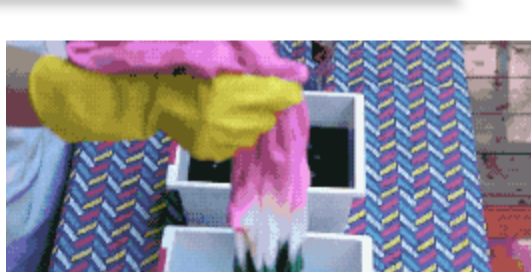

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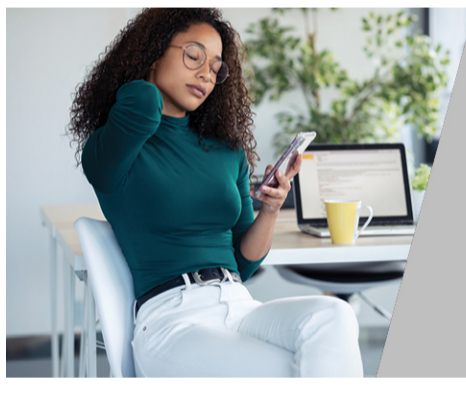
